



Optional Tour Thursday: WOS Provincial Park

Writing-on-Stone / Álshai'pi is a recognized UNESCO World Heritage Site. Located near the base of the Sweetgrass Hills along the Milk River Valley. The sedimentary rocks exposed in the Milk River valley were formed 85 million years ago at the edge of a great inland sea. Huge volumes of meltwater began eroding the soft sandstone after the last ice age. This is how the coulees and hoodoos you see today were formed. Writing-on-Stone is a sacred landscape; a landscape of special spiritual significance to the Blackfoot people who hunted and traveled these Great Plains since the beginning of time. The park contains the most significant concentration of protected First Nations' petroglyphs (rock carvings) and pictographs (rock paintings) on the Great Plains of North America. Indigenous people have come for generations to record their experiences, stories and practice their traditions by marking the sandstone cliffs of the Milk River Valley.
